Crooked River Ranch Farmers & Artisans Market

ne of the best things a community can do is to promote their local crafters, farmers, and artisans, which is described as a person producing something using a traditional method, for example breads, wines, and crafts. These are the people who share their trades which add to the personality and spirit of the community.

Farmers markets have a long history that dates to ancient times. According to some sources, farmers markets originated in Egypt over 5000 years ago, where farmers and craftsmen met in urban spaces to sell their goods. Purchases were usually trades rather than money transactions, and goods were valued by weight. The first market opened in the United States in 1730 in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. It was a favorite place to gather and socialize for their community.

This is exactly what Crooked River Ranch has going seasonally April through the month of December. Each month it is held on the 1st and 3rd Saturday, from 9:00am-3:00pm, located in the CRR Old Fire Hall at Shad and Hill Rd. Vendors must be residents of Crooked River Ranch and pay a \$5.00 vendor fee. There are approximately 12-15 vendors each time. The booths range from eggs, to jams, salsa, breads, homemade jewelry, and soaps. There are beautiful metal and wood crafts, sewn bags, crocheted winter hats and scarves and so much more.

This event has 3 volunteers that give of their time to organize the market and do so for the local residents of the ranch to have the opportunity to make money and display their talents whether they be a useful item or fun and decorative.

With the use of the CRR Old Fire Hall, the market is able to stay open in challenging weather conditions and in the summer months they can expand out into the parking lot.

espite the 21° temperature on Saturday morning following Thanksgiving, twelve brave volunteers met at the lower pasture near the Heritage House to clear the field of Russian thistle (aka tumbleweed). Though quite chilly, it was a perfect day for pulling and burning the invasive weed, which seems to be ubiquitous throughout Crooked River Ranch. With no wind and the sun warming the workers as the hours passed, numerous piles of Russian thistle went up in flames much to the enjoyment of the volunteers.

Crooked River Ranch Board Member Ara Erdekian organized and led the effort to clean the pasture. He saw a need and reacted. Although he has been involved in several similar cleanups, he says it is NOT his passion. He said he simply knew it needed to be done and knowing someone's *gotta do it*, he did. It didn't make sense to him to hire the work done. It could cost many thousands of dollars and he knew there would be Crooked River Ranch volunteers willing to pitch in and save that expense. Once the tumbleweed is removed, the pasture will be sprayed so it doesn't return next year. Ara says he planned this work party because his kids were home from school on Thanksgiving break. He plans to have another during the Winter break when again his kids will be home.

Russian thistle is a bushy summer annual commonly found in disturbed arid and semiarid areas. It matures in July through October. The mature plant is oval to round and can grow to a diameter of 18" to 6' under favorable conditions. It then breaks off at ground level and tumbles with the wind, dispersing seeds until it is stopped by some kind of barrier (fence, barn, culvert). A single plant can produce 250,000 seeds which can remain viable for a year. It is a sharp and spiny flower that can be dangerous to grazing livestock or curious pets.

Weed of the Year—Too Little, Too Late: A Tsunami of Russian Thistle

very year in early summer, we begin to see the seemingly harmless blue-green shoots with red stems poking out of the ground. Before we can turn around, it seems those small Russian Thistle plants have mushroomed into large reddish balls of stiff, sharp prickly stems and tiny, barely visible flowers. By fall, they are turning brown.

Believe it or not, they are easy to dig up at this stage as they have very shallow roots. This is because Russian Thistle, also known as Tumbleweed, is an annual plant. It only reproduces by seeds...thousands and thousands of seeds. It sheds those seeds by breaking loose at ground level and tumbling with the wind.

This year was a banner year for Russian Thistle due to the rainy spring and the long dry summer and fall. In November, I was still receiving



calls from residents of CRR about how to get rid of Russian Thistle before it starts to tumble and spread seed all over their neighbors' properties. It is too little, too late. Still, a few stalwart souls managed to clean up their yards with the gracious help of Mike O'Brien who opened the CRR Lion's Limb Dump numerous times to accommodate the disposal of Russian Thistle. Thank you, Mike!!!

I would like to propose an "All Out War" on Russian Thistle next year. If most of the CRR organizations agree to band together, we could increase the outreach

to our neighbors. We could even plan a final weekend in the fall where volunteers with appropriate trucks and trailers agree to pick up piles collected by neighbors and take them to the Limb Dump for burning. Give it some thought....





Gluteal Amnesia...It's Real!





sk my classes how many times I mention or point to the butt!

The gluteus maximus muscle is the largest muscle in the body and responsible for weight support, propulsion, stability, strength and gait control. The gluteus maximus stabilizes the sacroiliac joint – the junction of the spine and hips – important for strength and mechanics of walking and lifting objects.

Believe it or not there is an actual *issue* called Gluteal Amnesia or Dead Butt Syndrome! This can occur with a sedentary lifestyle or a job sitting for long periods. Sitting puts this muscle in its lengthened position. Over time basically the butt forgets how to work! Whether neurologic or circulatory pathology is the causative factor, the outcome may be the same. Without the gluteus maximus able to perform its important function you may find you have some of the following symptoms: fatigue in the lower back and hip area when walking, pain while sitting, discomfort that travels down the side of your leg or the back resembling sciatic pain, also possibly knee pain and ankle instability. The syndrome does not need to occur in both sides, only one of the gluteal muscles can be affected causing similar symptoms and imbalance.

If this resonates with you get ahead of the problem by standing every 30 minutes while sitting or working. While sitting try glute sets or squeezing both cheeks together making you rise slightly. Also squeeze one at a time alternately, note if one is stronger than the other. If you have a job where you sit for greater than 30-60 minutes without getting up or have a sedentary lifestyle and experience hip fatigue and/or pain you may want to consider seeing your doctor or a physical therapist to help correct the problem. Simple exercises can be found online.

riends and Neighbors of the Deschutes Canyon Area (FANs) is pleased to announce its first Lens on Learning program for 2024. Joshua Newman Collins, PhD, will present a fascinating and informative talk answering the question: *What IS the Sagebrush Sea?* on January 20, from 4-6 p.m. in the Juniper Room at the Crooked River Ranch administration building.

This program will cover three main topics:

- What and where is the sagebrush steppe ecosystem (a.k.a. the Sagebrush Sea)?
- What is the greater sage-grouse and why does it matter?
- What we can do to save the sage-grouse and its ecosystem?

Known for the male's elaborate mating displays in spring, the greater sage-grouse depends on sagebrush plants for its survival. But due to numerous environmental factors and habitat loss, their population over the years has been in steady decline. Dr. Collins will discuss the challenges of creating resilience in sage-grouse populations and sagebrush ecosystems. This will be an approximately one-hour presentation, followed by a brief question and answer session.



Dr. Collins received his doctorate in ecology in 1993 from the University of California at Berkeley. He has an extensive background in research and teaching covering subjects from nearshore marine to alpine ecosystems throughout the West. Retiring to Bend in 2021, Dr. Collins began working with the East Cascade Audubon Society (ECAS) to help conserve the sage steppe ecosystem of Oregon and neighboring states, with a focus on the greater sage-grouse. He currently chairs the Sage Science Team of ECAS and represents environmental non-governmental organizations on the Coordinating Council of the SageCon Partnership.

Lens on Learning programs are posted on Event-Brite and registration is required for attendees. Attendance is free for FANs members; a \$5 donation is requested for non-members. Registration for this event began Dec. 20, 2023, at www.fansofdeschutes.org.





RANCH BULLETIN BOARD BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

December 18, 2023

- The meeting was called to order by President Vickery. All Directors were present with the exception of Director Beveridge.
- Ranch Manager LaPora noted that it is the start of a new billing cycle and accounts owing are 2,154. It is also noted that payment plans increased by 13. She also reported that the CRP has been reviewed and work continues. The next BAC meeting is scheduled for January 17, 2024, at 10:00 am.
- Panorama Park MOU will be presented to the County Commissioners at their next meeting. It has been approved by other County Officials. The Water Company MOU is waiting to hear back from Manager Frank Day before proceeding.
- The pond bridge replacement project has been placed on hold for another year. It will be moved out on the CRP
- Director Erdekian has scheduled a work party to continue removal and burning of Russian Thistle for Wednesday, December 20, 2023, at 9:00 am. Volunteers are welcome.
- Mark Schneider, working as Lion's member, discussed both limbing and removal of Juniper Trees that surround Panorama Park. His vision included marking trees with tape for either limbing or removal and contacting neighbors that surround the park for their input. It would be made clear that if they did not want the trees removed/ limbed that it would be up to the homeowner to maintain the trees in an effort to assist with fire abatement.
- A motion to approve AFE #290 in the amount of \$26,842.23 for the purchase of a new tractor for the RV Park was made and approved unanimously.
- The CRR Water Company has requested that they be allowed to clean up an Association owned area behind their office for fire abatement purposes. A motion to allow the Water Company to clean up an area behind their office was made and approved unanimously.
- A motion to approve McKenzie "Mac" Walker for the BAC Committee was made and approved unanimously.
- President Vickery noted that there is caution tape surrounding the covered area next to the office and apartments. The structure is not used for anything meaningful. After a discussion it was decided that the best option would be to remove the roof structure but leave the horse panel corrals. Ranch Manager LaPora will discuss with General Maintenance Supervisor McRae. There are electrical boxes attached that need to be considered during removal. Resident Kent Inman knows someone that may be able to assist, and he will reach out for a possible bid.
- Regular meeting was adjourned to Executive Session at 7:07pm. Executive Session was called to order at 7:12pm and adjourned at 7:33pm with no action taken.




